Class summary

Learn a simple fabric collage technique by combining different patterns and colors of fabric into a scarf that becomes a work of art. Sample scarves will show a variety of design ideas and fabric combinations. Use silk, rayon, or cotton, either woven or knit. Blend colors, textures, solids, prints, plaids and stripes. Choose your fabrics, then create your own one-of-a-kind collage piece.

At the start of class, Janet will show scarves of different sizes and fabric combinations. She will describe the construction process using sample pieces. You will then choose two coordinating fabrics from pre-selected groupings and get to work assembling your fabric pieces. Written instructions will be provided, along with assistance from Janet. You should complete your scarf before the end of class

Depending on your sewing speed, you may have time to purchase more fabric and start a second scarf.

Fabric choices

Enough fabric to make one spiral twist scarf is included in your registration fee.

If you wish to make other scarves, start with choosing a piece of fabric that inspires you and gives you a direction. Then collect fabrics that harmonize and blend – they don't have to match exactly. Be adventurous! One common color in two very different prints can work together in a collage. Try different scales of florals, prints, plaids and stripes.

Supply list

- __ Sewing machine and its accessories
- __ Size 75/11 or 80/12 Universal sewing machine needles
- __ Several basic colors of thread (thread will not show on scarf)
- __ Fine glass head straight pins
- __ Fabric marking pen or chalk
- __ Sewing gauge and/or ruler
- __ Good fabric scissors
