## Important Information

- Classes in this brochure are taught by Fabrications owner Dick Dapson.
- Please register at least one week before class. *Payment must be made at the time of registration.* Refunds will not be given for missed classes. Make-up classes may be available (time permitting) at the rate of \$15.00 per hour.
- A class supply list, where applicable, will be issued upon registration.
- Should a class be cancelled, money will be completely refunded.
- Cancellation policy for registrants requires 24 hours notice. Because of preparation time and expenses incurred, 80% of the registration fee is refundable.
- Be aware that there may be homework with some of the classes. To get the most out of these classes, you must be able to complete the assigned homework.
- Some classes are offered only as *U-Pick*; others are scheduled for specific dates and times, but are also available as *U-Pick*. There is no minimum enrollment—we will do the class just for you. However, it is more fun and instructive when several people work together, so try to enroll a friend and double the fun.
- Registration is strictly on a first come, first served basis. Maximum enrollment is 4 students. Once a *U-Pick* day/time is reserved for one class, it is not available for another class. Other people wanting that class can enroll, even though someone else made the initial pick. *Do not put off making a U-Pick decision!*
- *You must speak directly to the class instructor to register for a U-Pick Class!*
- The stated class fees, prerequisites and length of session(s) apply to scheduled and *U-Pick* classes.
- All yarn and patterns must be purchased at Fabrications. Some classes require you to select yarn and make a gauging swatch before coming to the first class. Classes involving sweaters, slippers and socks assume that the garments are sized and fitted for you.

## Basic Level

### Projects

#### Simple Elegant Scarf

This class is open to anyone wanting to advance their skills from an elementary level. Students will learn how to read a pattern, create cables and make ribs while producing a fine quality scarf. Students must complete half of the scarf before the second session.

**Prerequisite: must be able to cast on, knit, purl and bind off.**

Purchase supplies before first class.

Two 2-hour sessions, includes yarn, needles and pattern: \$60.00

Class # 62.1, U-Pick only

#### Easy Hat With Bulky Yarn

This class is open to anyone wanting to advance their skills from an elementary level. We will make a knit hat with multicolored bulky yarn, using both stockinette and ribbed patterns. Students will learn how to read a pattern, and will learn several intermediate-level techniques, including ribbing, decreasing and knitting in the round on one circular needle.

**Prerequisite: must be able to cast on, knit, purl and bind off.**

Purchase supplies and knit a gauging swatch before first class.

Two 2-hour sessions, includes yarn, needles and pattern: \$60.00

Class # 64.1, U-Pick only

#### Fingerless Gloves

This class is open to anyone wanting to advance their skills from an elementary level. Students will learn how to read a pattern, knit in the round with a single circular needle, make ribbing and work with a provisional yarn to create the thumb.

**Prerequisite: must be able to cast on, knit, purl, and bind off.**

Two 2-hour sessions: \$40.00 registration fee plus variable kit fee for yarn, needles and pattern.

Class # 72.1, U-Pick only

## Elementary Level

### Techniques

#### Beginning Knitting

This class is for those with no prior knitting experience. It covers the four most basic steps (casting on, knitting, purling, binding off), as well as the two basic knitting structures (stockinette and garter stitch). Additionally, we will discuss needle types, yarns and gauge.

**Prerequisite: none.**

One 2-hour session, includes yarn and needles: \$30.00

## Intermediate Level

### Techniques

#### Introduction to Short Rows

Short rows are made when you turn back before reaching the end of a row, creating pie-shaped wedges for artistic or functional effects. Wrap and turn, and unwrap are the maneuvers to accomplish this. When combined with slipped stitches and bound-off slipped stitches, seamless gussets can be formed to make great looking sock heels and toes, among other things.

**Prerequisite: must be able to cast on, knit, purl and bind off, and to follow a pattern.**

Bring your own yarn and needles

One 2-hour session, includes yarn and needles: \$20.00

## Intermediate Level

### Projects

#### Easy Felted Slipper

This class teaches how to make a felted slipper that folds flat for easy storage or packing. New techniques include a provisional cast-on, knitting flat for part of the slipper, then joining in the round on a single circular needle. After the toe is finished, a nearly invisible seam will replace the provisional cast-on yarn and will close the back of the slipper. Instructions for felting are included. Both slippers can be knitted in about 10-12 hours.

**Prerequisite: must be able to cast on, knit, purl and bind off, as well as increase, decrease and knit in the round.**

Purchase supplies and knit a gauging swatch before first class.

Two 2-hour sessions, includes yarn and needles: \$65.00

## Advanced Level

### Projects

#### Custom Sweater

This class teaches you how to custom-fit a sweater specifically for your body, using almost any style you wish. The sweater will be knit top-down. Choose from cardigan or pull-over, close-fitting or full styling, sleeveless vest or sleeved (any length), with various neck styles (turtleneck, crew, V or scoop). The first session is devoted to developing the pattern; measurements will be taken, so wear a close-fitting top and bring a calculator. You will also start knitting as a single piece (no seams). The other two sessions will get you through armhole construction, styling the body and applying trim. When you sign up for the class, we will decide on style choices and yarn.

**Prerequisite: must be an experienced knitter who can follow a pattern and perform simple calculations.**

Purchase supplies and knit a gauging swatch before first session.

Three 2-hour sessions: \$60.00 registration fee plus kit fee (variable) for needles and yarn. Additional sessions are available at \$15 per session.

#### Toe-Up Seamless Socks

This advanced class is for those who would like a rewarding challenge. Most socks are knitted from the top down, use flaps to create the heel, and end with a sewn closure for the toe. Knitting from the toe up eliminates seams and allows a custom fit, even to the point of having right and left socks if you so desire. We will use the single-needle, magic loop method of circular knitting.

**Prerequisite: must be an experienced knitter comfortable with circular knitting, who can follow a pattern, perform simple calculations and is familiar with short row techniques (see class on Introduction to Short Rows)**

Purchase supplies and knit a gauging swatch before first session.

Three 2-hour sessions: \$60.00 registration fee plus kit fee (variable) for needles and sock yarn.
